DRAFT MINUTES
Special Commission Meeting December 18th, 2014
Redding City Council Chambers

(These minutes are not intended to be a verbatim transcription of the proceedings and discussion associated with the business on the Commission's agenda; rather, what follows is a summary of the order of business and general nature of testimony, Commission deliberation, and action taken.)

1. CALL TO ORDER

- a. Chairman Morgan called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m. at the Redding City Council Chambers, 777 Cypress, Redding, California.

Present: Chairman Morgan, Vice-Chairman Farr, Commissioners Baugh, Fyten, Haynes, Kehoe, Yarbrough. Alternate Commissioner Fust and Richardson were in the audience.

Staff Present: Executive Officer Jan Lopez, Attorney Jim Underwood, Manager Kathy Bull, Clerk Linda Romig.

Absent: None.

- b. Alternate Commissioner Yarbrough led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Chris Kobe from Mountain Gate thanked Jan Lopez and staff for holding the application until the Tax Exchange agreement is completed.

Commissioner Farr stated the Executive Committee which handles the layout of the agenda did not remember that this was to be discussed and stated there was no problem in pulling it from correspondence. Commissioner Kehoe formally pulled it off the calendar for consent.

Commissioner Baugh stated the agenda packet did not include a letter from John Duckett, City Manager of the City of Shasta Lake, regarding the newly adopted Sphere of Influence for the City of Shasta Lake and asked to read the letter. Ms. Lopez stated the letter Commissioner Baugh was speaking about was only received the day prior to the meeting and would be included in the next meeting agenda for discussion. When questioned about discussing a letter not included on the agenda, Commissioner Baugh responded he only wanted to read the letter, not discuss it and proceeded to read the letter. Commissioner Baugh requested that this item be placed on the next agenda for reconsideration of the prior adoption of the Sphere of Influence for the City of Shasta Lake, and the Commission consented.

Mr. Underwood noted that the item pulled (7.g.) relates to agenda item 11.d. and the commission could consider discussion at this point or later and left it at the Commission's discretion.

As clarification, Commissioner Baugh mentioned he had requested at the December 4, 2014 to have an item (now listed as 7.g.) regarding Chief Hebrard in order to discuss response to comments made by Chief Hebrard at the November 6th meeting. Commissioner Baugh talked about a series of documents not provided to the rest of the commission, and made observations about the content of documents. He expressed concern about Chairman Morgan and Commission Clerk Romig contacting CAL Fire, and the Executive Officer responding to Chief Hebrard comments of November 6th, and noted that the board acts at the direction of the public by the majority of the board. Commissioner Kehoe thanked Commissioner Baugh for calling it to the Commission's attention.

Chief Hebrard requested to speak in response to the Executive Officer comments originally presented on December 4, 2015 and resubmitted for December 18, 2015. He discussed bullet point seven in a staff report presented on November 6, 2015 regarding the Fall River valley coordinated Fire Protection District Sphere of Influence and shared his concerns.

Commissioner Kehoe moved for a recess at 9:35 a.m. to determine the status of the Executive Officer. Chairman Morgan called the meeting back in session at 9:36 a.m. after the return of the Executive Officer.

Hearing was open to the public. Pat Minturn, County Public Works Director stated he would answer any questions on behalf of the County. The public hearing was closed.

Commissioner Haynes had a question regarding the budget listed on page 6 with Pat Minturn providing answers.

Commissioner Baugh asked if the map reflected the addition of 3,930 acres mentioned on page seven. Pat Minturn stated looking at the red line on the boundary map, he believed it to be accurate. 5) CSA #6 – Jones Valley

Ms. Lopez provided information regarding the Jones Valley Sphere of Influence. The public hearing was open to the public. Pat Minturn provided answers asked by the Commissioners.

Steve Boyd, a rater payer in CSA #6 Jones Valley Water and live in the Elk Trail Community. He shared his concerns regarding evidence of extreme water loss and asked that his written comment be added to the Jones Valley report.

Burt Stead, thanked the Commission for the job being done, and asked that his letter to LAFCO be included in the report.

Roy Vincent, shared his concerns regarding water loss of eleven million gallons of water loss between January and August of 2014.

Nancy Wallin, a volunteer on the CSA #6 Board since 2002, had been told by public work that a 24% water loss was normal. Later it was learned an amount of 20% water loss was not normal and the district has seen water loss as high as 40%.

Clydine Bucannon served as an officer on Elk Trail while trying to get water. She thanked the LAFCO board for all the hard work and supported approval of the Municipal Services Review.

Peter Scales shared his experience with the County Public Works in trying to get water to his property. Hearing was closed to the public.

There was discussion regarding the inclusion of public documents in the MSR/SOI reports as it had not been included in the past documents.

8) Buckeye Fire Protection District

Ms. Lopez stated this item should be continued to the February meeting as no enough information had been provided.

Public hearing was open to the public.

Jerry Gray, Deputy Fire Chief from City of Redding, stated they had not been discussion regarding annexation between the City and the Buckeye board.

The public hearing was left open and was continued to the February 19, 2015 meeting.

9) Fall River Valley Coordinated FPD SOI

There was lengthy discussion regarding the coordinated Sphere of Influence, with references to.

Public Hearing was opened to the public.

Jerry Monath, resident of Fall River Valley, talked about the fire districts work together in the valley, and a sphere of influence that combines all three fire districts would be a first step to coordination.

Michael Hebrard, Chief Shasta County Fire Department, shared concerns regarding the maps, boundaries and information that had been included in the report. He handed out a proposed map the Fall River Valley area.

Brent Cassidy, Executive Officer of Lassen FPD, provided information regarding the four fire departments, three Boards and three Chiefs, and shared concerns regarding the Sphere of Influence.

Joe Bruce explained the Sphere Of Influence should include the valley floor of Fall River Valley, and wasn't in favor of Cassel being included.

Greg Mayers, Chief of Soldier Mountain, provided information regarding the services provided. He stated that the Lassen National Park is sixty miles south of their location and is covered under the CAL Fire direct protection agreement, and do provide services to the Lassen National Forest.

Don Sanberg, Assistant Chief of Soldier Mountain provided information regarding the formation of Soldier Mountain. He shared his concerns regarding the Sphere of Influence.

Gene R. Rogers, volunteer at Soldier Mountain Fire Station stated the Sphere of Influence would be a road map to future changes and is concerned about mutual aid agreements.

Don Chaix, Cassel Fire Chief stated Exhibit B in the report shows Cassel within the boundaries of the Sphere of Influence. He stated Soldier Mountain was a great asset to the County.

Edie Balter, a Cassel resident, stated residents had not been notified that LAFCO had put Cassel inside the Sphere of Influence, and shared corrections that should be made to the report.

Barbara Briggs, commended the Commissioners and Ms. Lopez for handling the backlog of work that had been completed, and gave advantages to having the coordinated Sphere of Influence.

After lengthy discussion regarding various issues with the Sphere of Influence, continuing the hearing to a future date was discussed.
